AIYEHUM: Project Proposal Submission

- 1. Project title
- 2. Problem description
- 3. Solution to the problem
- 4. Impact on humanity or a community







AIYEHUM: Shortlisted project proposals

- All shortlisted project teams will be given a grant of up to USD 500 for prototype development and completion of the project.
- A mentor will be assigned to the shortlisted project teams if they do not have one.
- All shortlisted project team members will be given a certificate of achievement from IEEE R10 once their final report is received by the organising committee.







All IEEE Young Engineers' Humanitarian Challenge

- Jury members are senior members of academics, industry, NGO, etc. who has a good experience in at least one of the technical areas mentioned earlier.
- Members of the Jury will go through the projects and shortlist them based on pre-specified criteria and guidelines.

- A mentor is a senior member of academics, industry, NGO, etc. who has a good experience in at least one of the technical areas mentioned earlier.
- A mentor will guide the team to complete the project in a professional manner. He/she will also keep the committee informed of the progress of project.



AIYEHUM: Shortlisted project proposals

- The winners will be awarded with prizes and certificates in a suitable ceremony.
- The top team will be invited to present their work in one of the IEEE R10 Conference/meeting. Their trip will be partially funded by the IEEE.
